Of the property's twelve penthouse homes, a spectacular 10,000-square-foot, dual-level Grand Penthouse features 4,000 square feet of multiple outdoor terraces – a design distinction found nowhere else in San Francisco's luxury high-rises. The Grand Penthouse is priced at \$49 million, the most expensive condominium listing in San Francisco.

At the forefront of urban luxury living, Four Seasons Private Residences at 706 Mission, San Francisco delivers exceptional residential experiences unlike any other, including a richly appointed amenity floor on the tower's fifth level.
