

Free Palestine protest march

MAIDENHEAD: Protesters were heard marching through the town centre at the weekend as demonstrations continued over an ongoing conflict in the Middle East. Groups of people could be heard chanting and holding 'Free Palestine' banners and megaphones near Maidenhead Town Hall on Saturday afternoon.

Protests have been taking place across the country – most notably in London – following unrest between Israel and Palestine over the past few days.

Partial closure of A404 for resurfacing work

MARLOW: Part of the A404 will be closed overnight for five weeks while Highways England carries out resurfacing works.

The closure will affect the southbound carriageway from the Handy Cross roundabout in High Wycombe, to the Westhorpe roundabout at Marlow.

Work will also include renewing the road markings, road studs and laying anti-skid surfacing.

The closure of the road started on Monday and will last until Friday, June 18, overnight Monday to Friday, 9pm-6am.

A signed diversion is in place via Wycombe Road, Highways England has said.

A further overnight closure will also affect drivers travelling from Marlow to Bisham next month.

The A404 southbound carriageway, from the Marlow Westhorpe Interchange to the Bisham roundabout, will be closed overnight on Monday, June 28 and Tuesday, June 29.

A signed diversion will be in place via Henley-on-Thames for vehicles under 7.5 tonnes. Vehicles over this weight will be diverted via the M40, M25 and M4.

"We'd advise all motorists to stick to the signed diversion route as this has been chosen with both suitability and safety in mind," Highways England said.

"We'd also encourage drivers to stick to speed limits and follow appropriate signage to ensure the safety of those working on site and fellow road users."

THE ROYAL BOROUGH OF WINDSOR & MAIDENHEAD (STUBBLES LANE, COOKHAM DEAN) (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) ORDER 2021

The Royal Borough of Windsor & Maidenhead intends, not less than seven days from the date of this Notice, to make an Order, the effect of which will be to:

Prohibit any vehicle from proceeding along Stubbles Lane for its entire length.

The alternative route for vehicles affected by the proposed Order is via Bigfrith Lane and Church Road.

The purpose of the proposed Order is to facilitate works in the said road, namely to install fibre optic ducts and as a result there will be the likelihood of danger to the public.

Maidenhead MP Theresa May has backed calls for public notices to remain in local newspapers, saying it's important the public is made aware of developments which affect them.

Former Prime Minister Theresa May has backed the News Media Association's (NMA) calls for public notices to remain a requirement in local newspapers.

The Government's proposed Planning Bill is seeking to overhaul and digitise the UK's planning system.

The reforms claim the system needs to be modernised and residents should not have to rely on 'planning notices attached to lampposts, printed in newspapers or posted in libraries'. But the NMA is urging the Government to keep the requirement for local authorities to print public notices about upcoming developments in local newspapers.

Maidenhead MP Theresa May told the Advertiser she agreed it was important the public are made aware of

developments which can affect them.

She said: "I have in the past raised this as an issue and I think it's important.

"I know the Advertiser has changed the way it presents some of these local issues so it's more obvious for people what the issues are and people can see them more easily which is a good thing. In terms of notifications I think it's important the requirement continues for public notices to be put in local newspapers."

Road closure for fibre optics works

This week's public notices contain information on a road closure in Cookham Dean and a series of extensions to properties in Maidenhead and Holyport.

TRAFFIC AND TRAVEL

The council will be closing a Cookham Dean road for a working week next month as it carries out fibre optic works in the area.

Vehicles will not be allowed to travel down Stubbles Lane for its entire length between 8am and 6pm from Monday, June 7 until Friday, June 11.

An alternative route for drivers will be provided via Bigfrith Lane and Church Road.



PLANNING

An application to build a series of extensions to a Maidenhead property has been submitted to the council.

St Johns, at 9 Langworthy Road, wants to construct a

single storey rear and front extension and complete a garage conversion.

Associated works include raising the roof, complete with new rooflights, and replacing cladding.

Elsewhere, in Holyport, a house wants to build a single and two storey side/rear extension and rebuild an existing chimney.

Works at 9 Pamela Row will also, if approved, include the replacement of the front door and windows following demolition of an existing extension there.

Over in Shurlock Row, Morland House, in Hungerford Lane, has applied to the Royal Borough council for approval to build a tennis court.
