A second century of service

JEWISH FAMILY SERVICE GALA

Jewish Family Service had its beginnings in 1918, shortly after the First World War ended. Always committed to making a positive difference in people's lives, the organization's focus evolved toward family strengthening and counseling, eventually becoming a client-centered, impact-driven human services agency working to build a stronger, healthier, more resilient San Diego. Its approach is rooted in supportive personal relationships and strong community partnerships, and the services it delivers foster the health, skills, confidence, and resilience of every person it serves. Through a range of integrated services, JFS touches the lives of many thousands of people annually, regardless of their faith or background.

Its annual "Heart & Soul" fundraising gala is held every April. Last year's gala celebrated the success of JFS' first 100 years, and the recent 2019 event began its second century. Held as usual at the Hyatt Regency La Jolla, it was an evening of captivating stories and magical moments — including entertaining close-up and on-stage illusions performed by "Magic Mike."

A reception in (and around) the Hyatt's glass pavilion began the festivities. A big silent auction enticed bidders. Sushi on a Roll worked a large sushi bar on the patio, and there was a risotto bar indoors. Both got rave reviews, and were so popular that it was difficult to lure the 600 guests into the ballroom for dinner and the event program.

Gala chairs Jamie Carr, Erin Combs Pearl, and Scott Schindler welcomed them. CEO Michael Hopkins and board chair Marie Raftery spoke of JFS' work in the San Diego community (which was also illustrated on six video screens). A paddle-raise drew generous pledges, and when the total approached the \$200,000 honorary gala chairs Evelyn and Ernest Rady had promised to match, the Radys promptly lifted the limit! A live auction offered concert packages for Paul McCartney at Petco Park, and Billy Joel in New York (with a choice of Broadway shows).

After a dinner featuring Antarctic salmon superbly prepared by the Hyatt's chef, the 2019 Mitzvah Honorees were introduced. Ilene Mittman and Aviva Saad were honored for their inspiring work and dedication at JFS' Balboa Avenue Older Adult Center, which provides an uplifting environment and programs for individuals and families affected by Alzheimer's disease and related dementias. Norma Chavez-Peterson, ACLU of San Diego and Imperial Counties executive director, accepted the award for the ACLU's partnership in launching the San Diego Rapid Response Network.

After an announcement that the overall event had raised a record-setting \$1.5 million, Bonnie Foster Productions began to play and partygoers filled the dance floor.
